

Transvaginal Ultrasound

Your doctor has ordered a transvaginal ultrasound.

There is no prep necessary for this examination.

This test is similar to a pelvic exam that your doctor performs. It is a vaginal ultrasound to best visualize your uterus, ovaries, endometrial lining and the areas between your ovaries and uterus.

When you are brought back for your exam, the sonographer will have you use the restroom, as this exam is best performed with an EMPTY bladder.

Next, you will be brought into the exam room, and undress from the waist down.

The exam is done using a vaginal ultrasound transducer. This device is covered with a latex condom and a lubricating jelly is used. The ultrasound is placed into the vagina and images are obtained for the physician to evaluate.

Please inform the sonographer if you have a latex allergy, as a non-latex cover will then be utilized.

The exam should take approximately 10-15 minutes to perform.

If you have an appointment with your physician following this exam, the physician will review the ultrasound results with you at that time. If you do not have an appointment following the ultrasound, the physician will review your ultrasound and you will receive the results via the patient portal.
